As you stroll the streets of historic downtown Eatonton, you'll get a taste of Eatonton's rich history and architecture featuring over 100 Antebellum and Victorian-era residential and commercial buildings in the historic district.

Lunch at Tastee Chick

Rock Hawk Effigy

One of two Native American bird-shaped effigies in Putnam County, Rock Hawk features something for everyone. The drive from downtown Eatonton to the effigy is along one of the state's Historic Scenic Byway's and you will surely find out why. At the effigy, view the historic shape from the observation tower, hike one of the trails, view historical markers, and see a local mural depicting Putnam County history.

Shopping at Harmony Crossing
