Eatonton was founded in 1808, and quickly became a center for education, culture, and banking. A great number of imposing residents were erected during the decade leading up to the Civil War. Thankfully, Sherman spared these dwellings on his March to the Sea.

Eatonton experienced difficulty recovering from the war, until Benjamin Hunt established the dairy industry in Putnam County, which soon became the Dairy Capitol of Georgia.

Today, classic antebellum architecture can be seen from every corner of the tree-lined streets of historic Eatonton. A Historic Walking Guide points out some of the most beautiful and unique houses among over 100 Greek Revival, Victorian, Queen Anne, Piedmont Plain, and Gothic Revival homes in the city and county.




